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Recording Evidence



If you go on a beast hunt, you should always record evidence. What beasts can you see near your own home? Maybe there is a bird in your garden, or a squirrel in the local park. Write or draw your evidence below.

Special Bunting

Lottie and her friends make banners to keep the badgers safe.
Why not make your own bunting?

You will need:

- Paper or card triangles
- String or ribbon
- A hole punch
- Fun coloured pens

What you do:

- Decide what message you want to write. Count the letters and make sure you have enough paper or card triangles so that each letter can go on a different triangle.
- Use the hole punch to make holes along the short sides of the triangles.
- Write one letter on each triangle. Decorate them, too!
- Thread your string or ribbon through the holes in the triangles.
- Ask a grown-up to help you hang the bunting!

Stakeout Hot Chocolate

The Branksea Adventurers love hot chocolate. Here's a recipe so you can make your own. Make sure to ask an adult to help you!



Ingredients (makes 2):

- 500ml milk
- 4 tbsps cocoa powder
- 4 tpsps sugar
- ½ teaspoon vanilla extract
- Pinch of salt

You will need:

- Small saucepan
- Measuring spoons
- Small whisk
- Two mugs

How to:

- With a grown-up there to help you, gently heat the cocoa powder, sugar, salt and 4 tbsps of the milk in a small saucepan. Whisk until the cocoa and sugar have dissolved.
- Slowly pour in the rest of the milk and whisk every so often, until it is hot.
- Remove from heat and stir in the vanilla extract.
- Carefully pour into two mugs. Top with mini marshmallows if you like!
- Wait for it to cool a little, then enjoy your hot chocolate.



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
