What is World Book Day?

The charity World Book Day was set up more than 25 years ago to encourage children and young people to love books and reading. Every year on the first Thursday in March, World Book Day organises events and activities in schools, libraries and other community settings to encourage children to read for fun, with some dressing up as their favourite book characters. Fundamental to our impact is giving children the opportunity to exchange a token for a free book, so that every child can discover the possibilities of reading for pleasure.



How does World Book Day make a difference?

With your support, World Book Day brings books and a love of reading to the children who need them most. We aim to:

Give every child a book of their own

Every year we distribute over 50 million £1 and €1.50 book tokens for children and young people to exchange for a FREE brilliant book – or to get £1 or €1.50 off another book worth more than £2.99.

For 1 in 5 children receiving free school meals, the book they chose to buy with their £1 book token is the first book of their own.

Encourage more children to read for pleasure

We provide resources and activities that inspire children to read for fun, helping to transform attitudes and behaviour among children and families.

Work with local communities to give more children access to books

5 book-tastic ideas to fundraise your way

Get your colleagues, friends or family together for a brilliant World Book Day celebration. Here are some simple ideas to get you started:

1

Games Time

Try some booky twists on your favourite party games. Ask everyone to donate to play, and provide nibbles or drinks to make it a real celebration.

You might get some reading recommendations too!



Everyone drops a book title into a hat. Each person pulls out a title to enact.

NEVER HAVE I EVER...

Take turns trying to find books that haven't been written using the phrase 'Never have I ever...' eg:

- Never have I ever read a book with a vampire as the main character
- *Never have I ever read a book set* [name a place!]

If someone can think of a book that exists they get a point, but if no-one can think of something you do.

TWO TRUTHS AND A LIE

Tell two truths and a lie about a book you've read. You can even include a fake title if you want to really trip people up.

GAME ON FOR WORLD BOOK DAY

Take part in our **timed gaming challenge** and stream for 5 hours for the 1 in 5 children who said that the book they 'bought' with their World Book Day book token had been their first book of their own.



Reading Hour

There are lots of ways you can promote the idea of reading for pleasure on World Book Day. You could set up a comfy corner with a selection of books and ask people to donate to read for an hour during their work day. You could also encourage people to head home early (for a donation) so they can read with their children (or for their own pleasure!).

Best Dressed

Invite people to DRESS UP AS A CHARACTER OR A BOOK in return for a donation — and tell those who don't to donate double!

Put a spin on the day and ask people to come as a character from a genre such as crime, classic literature, fairytales, childhood favourites, or books that have been made into movies. And be sure to award a prize for the best outfit.

Or try the CARDBOARD CHALLENGE! Gather cardboard boxes and other craft materials and challenge people to come up with the best costume. Give them a time limit to make it even more fun. You can find ideas using our character guides from this year's £1/€1.50 books here.



Visit the World Book Day shop where you'll find a range of clothing, badges and accessories to help you show your love for books and reading for pleasure and support our charity's work at the same time.



Book Swap Socials

Set aside a shelf at work (or at home or local community venue) for people to share their favourite books, and to take a book they haven't read before (for a donation). People could add a personal note or bookmark explaining why a book is special to them. You could also host a lunchtime reading group or arrange sessions for people to read passages from their chosen books.

Booky Bake Sale

Boost your fundraising and get the party started by selling homemade cakes and treats. If people can fashion book-themed cakes, even better!



Highlights from 2023

- 90,000 £1/€1.50 books donated by publishers distributed directly to children in disadvantaged communities across the UK and ROI with support from McDonald's.
- 1,930 libraries joined in the celebrations with storytelling events, displays and activities sharing the joy of reading and book discovery.
- Over 4,000 booksellers got involved with colourful displays, events and pop-up bookshops.
- Parents in prisons across the UK were given books to give to their children during visiting times.
- Over 960,000 children enjoyed in-person and digital event in partnership with the National Literacy Trust and BookTrust; and tuned in to the World Book Day BBCTeach Live Lesson.
- 52.1% of teachers reported that World Book Day is extremely or very effective for children who are not interested in reading.

Give lots of notice. Put the date in everyone's diary as far in advance as possible.	website here .
The more the merrier. Invite your friends or colleagues and ask them all to extend the invitation wider!	Decide how to collect donations. You could set up a JustGiving page as part of our campaign (see page 11), collect cash, or both.
Suggest donation amounts. Whether for cakes, party entry or games, suggesting a donation amount can encourage people to donate even more throughout your World Book Day celebration. (And remember that not everyone will feel able to afford a donation.)	Shout about your event. 
