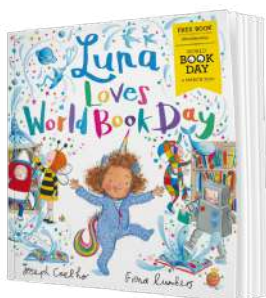


What to read next after your World Book Day book

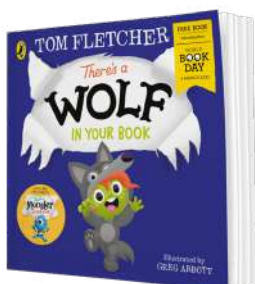

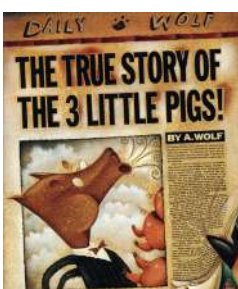
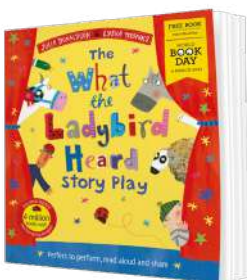
Do Not Bring Your Dragon to the Library

A fun cautionary tale about what happens if you try to take your Dragon to the library... but your Dragon loves to read so how do you get books for him?



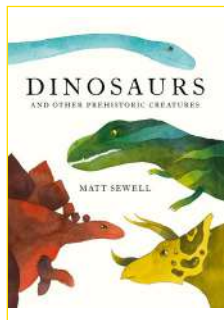
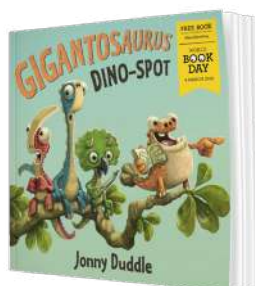
One Button Benny

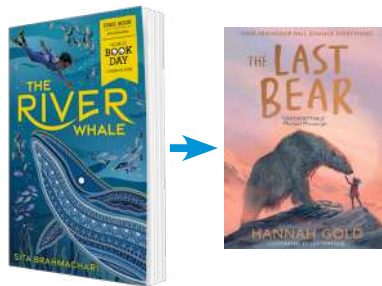
Little Badman and the Invasion of the Killer Aunties

This is a story about an eagle huntress, an inventor and an organ made of icicles. But it is also a story about belonging, even at the very edges of our world.



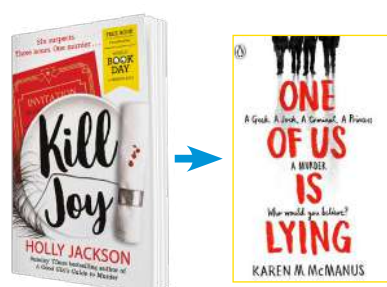
The Last Bear
