We want to see more children, particularly those from disadvantaged backgrounds, with a life-long habit of reading for pleasure and the improved life chances this brings them.

Your **World Book Day** Activity Bank

Celebration activities are a special part of **World Book Day**. There are lots of fun, inclusive activities to encourage reading for pleasure and make sure all children and their families and carers can enjoy **World Book Day**.

Here are some ideas for social and shared experiences that all children can take part in.

FOR CHILDREN

Being read to regularly

Read aloud selector

Challenge your children to be creative and transform a wooden spoon into a chosen book from home or your setting.

Place the spoons in a jar and use to choose read alouds throughout the day.

Share extracts as tasters

Use our £1/€1.50 book '**Look Insides**' to get some tasters.

Invite parents into story time

Showing is better than telling – host a cosy story sharing event for parents and children to engage with reading together.

Focus on the habit

Ask children to come in pyjamas or comfy clothes and bring their favourite bedtime reading. Share the benefits of reading as a home activity - and the children can get recommendations from their friends!

Access to books at home

World Book Day's £1/€1.50 books

Giving children the opportunity to choose and own a book of their own is at the heart of World Book Day.

Connect with your local bookseller: early conversations can help your children get the $\pm 1/ \in 1.50$ books for free.

Bookshops are brilliant places to discover reading. They can create a great experience for your children in their shop or you can work with them to bring the $\pm 1/\pm 1.50$ book token and $\pm 1/\pm 1.50$ book exchange closer to your setting, and create a relationship that can go on beyond World Book Day.

FOR CHILDREN

RESOURCES

Children to choose what they want to read

Invite parents in for a 'choose tonight's bedtime story' activity. Model supporting children to choose based on family interests and offer tips about how to share, or better still show them with your own bedtime story at the end of the event.

Having trusted adults and peers sharing and recommending books

Dressing up

A popular way to encourage children (particularly reluctant readers) to engage with reading, to swap reading recommendations and to celebrate what children are reading at home.

Tips to make dressing up inclusive and a way to celebrate children's book choices:

- Just 3 items: can children create a character or book from just 3 items from home or setting?
- Does your letter to parents focus on the child's choice of book?
- A rail stocked with various hats, capes, coats and tails can provide key elements of costume to support children's understanding of character across the year. Host a costume swap, or parents might be able to help source costumes.
- Provide options for children who prefer non-fiction offer options to share favourite facts or be the author using costumes or props.

Offer alternatives

- Make badges.
- Customise t-shirts.
- Dress up a lifesize drawing draw round the children on wallpaper and invite them to create themselves as a character.
 Display the finished characters in a gallery for the others to explore or even invite parents to look at what you've created.

If your setting is dressing up, celebrate choice (avoid giving prizes for best costume, which can exclude some children)

Time to read

Help embed reading into everyone's day:

Make reading part of non-curriculum time

Create a cosy reading space – it could even feature special guests. A pop-up will make it more compelling.

FOR STAFF

Being read to regularly

Host a real or virtual visit to a bookseller to support staff in finding books for the setting. Share a story at the beginning of every staff meeting.

Access to books at home

Review policies and spaces around children's access to the books in your setting Are staff able to promote to both children and parents?

Find your local bookshop <u>HERE</u>. Discuss possibilities for engaging with them.

Children to choose what they want to read

Invite staff to reflect on their reading identities and preferences

How can these be meaningfully shared with children?

Have a holiday reading shelf in the staff room

Do you know what your parents' reading preferences are? How can this be brought into the setting?

Having trusted adults and peers sharing and recommending books

Create a shared list of where you find good book recommendations. Here are some to get you started: BookTrust | National Literacy Trust | Centre for Literacy in Primary Education Open University | Local bookshop | Library

Dressing up

Children love seeing their teachers engaging with this very public book recommendation – make sure staff expectations are the same as childrens' and that teachers are focusing on sharing a loved read with their children.

The reading experience is fun

Termly staff book club

Staff reading bingo


Create a challenge sheet and offer prizes-some ideas include:

- read aloud every day for a week
- get a reading recommendation from a parent
- get a reading recommendation from a child
- get a reading recommendation from a librarian/bookseller
- make a reading recommendation to a child.

Time to read


Ask staff to participate in DEAR (Drop Everything and Read) to model reading to children and give them time to read themselves.





Sample letter to parents

You can use our editable letter to parents below to let them know about World Book Day celebrations in your setting.

Dear parents and caregivers,

World Book Day takes place on Thursday 2 March and we hope you'll join us as we come together to celebrate World Book Day.

Framing changes to your celebrations around the cost of living crisis

Every year on World Book Day we are overwhelmed by the enthusiasm of our Early Years community. We know that this year many families will find themselves in a difficult financial situation - we don't want our celebrations to be an additional burden.

Dressing up or bringing books into settings can be a big part of the celebrations and what families particularly enjoy about World Book Day. We ask that you consider the impact on the children who aren't able to take part in this way.

We will have lots of fun activities taking place throughout the day including:

Reading to your children:

- We'd love to invite you along to our bedtime story at XXXX.
- Our book corner will have special guests all day sign up here if you'd like to be one of them.
- Please send your child's chosen book in with them on the day so we can read it to them and their friends.

Access to books at home:

• We'll be hosting a book swap. Please drop off your unwanted books in the box outside the setting. Whether or not you've got a book to bring along to swap, come and browse and find something you might like to read.

Use your £1/€1.50 World Book Day book token to get a **FREE** book! • Children choosing what they want to read

The children will be choosing the £1/€1.50 book they like the look of – the bookmark with their choice and the book token to swap are attached to this letter. Join our open library session and help your child choose their next book to read at home- this is a good chance for you to become familiar with the books in our setting, too.

- Having trusted adults and peers sharing and recommending books
 - o We will be using World Book Day as a way to share our favourite books.
 - o We will be dressing up this year.
 - We want the children to use their costumes to share their favourite books and we encourage you to use things you already have at home.
 - We will be hosting a costume swap on DATE/TIME
 - We will be opening the setting with a selection of materials to choose from to make costumes on DATE/TIME
 - o We won't be dressing up this year; instead we will:
 - Invite children to wear their pyjamas
 - Be making costumes in our setting join us to see what they've made DATE TIME
 - Be making spoon puppets/potatoes of the children's favourite characters
 - Creating a lifesize gallery of the children as their favourite characters.

Design a National Book Token competition


