



### About the book:


Welcome! You have landed in Funny FACTopia!, a world of hilarious, weird and amazing facts.



### Book chat:

1. What's the funniest fact you've ever heard?
2. Would you rather find out a fact about astronaut nappies or farting zebras?
3. What do you think is the best way of finding out new facts or information? Can you think of 3 different ways you could do this?



### A game you could play:

#### Fact or not?

See if you can trick your partner. Tell them three things, two of which are fake, and only one of which is true.

See if they can spot the one that is really true! Try to keep a totally straight face when you tell each one. For example:

“My granny used to live in a house that's now at the bottom of the sea.”

“My dad went to school with [insert name of famous person].”

“I have 6 books about dinosaurs.”

### Activity 1:

Make your own fact trail to follow. Write some linked facts on pieces of paper and lay these out in a trail in your living room. Follow the trail by stepping from fact to fact. You could re-create one of the trails in the book or use other facts that you know.



### Activity 2:

Create a family fact trail by laying family photos out on a table and adding your fun family facts. For example:

- This is dad. Dad likes chocolate ice cream.



- This is Auntie Liz. One time a seagull stole Auntie Liz's chocolate ice cream cone.



- This is Grandad. Grandad loves birds, even seagulls...

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
