Book chat:

1. What do you like best about spending time with your family or friends?

If the weather is rainy, you can hold your Family Fun Day indoors! Be creative with what you already have at home. Maybe a picnic on a blanket in the living room, play musical statues or create a 'family talent show' where everyone gets a turn to perform.

Activity 1:

Make some simple puppets and then act out the story with your child.

Use some envelopes – seal the envelopes up and then cut open one side. Turn the envelope around so that the opening is at the bottom – this makes a simple 'glove' which you can put your hand inside. Your child can draw the puppet character on the envelope. (Scrap envelopes would work for this as well – tape them up and use the side without writing as the front of the puppet.) You could either make Peppa Pig family puppets and act out the story – or make puppets of your own family and act out a trip to the park.

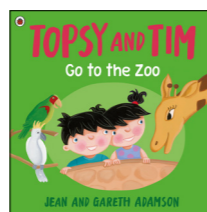
Activity 2:

Book chat:

1. Have you ever heard or seen a thunderstorm? What does it feel like?
2. Can you think of a time you needed to be brave? What did you do?
3. When did you last do something to help a friend or someone in your family?

A game you could play:

Thunder and Lightning

Here's a game for 2 or more players.

Choose one player to "control" the storm and all the others must do as they say. When Player 1 says "Thunder!" all the other players stamp their feet like rumbling thunder. When Player 1 says "Lightning!" all the other players jump up and freeze like a lightning bolt.

You could also add "Rain!" by wiggling your fingers down like falling rain, or "Sunshine!" by stretching up as high as you can.

Activity 1:

Play 'find the kitten'. One of you is Halo or Rocky and the other is Casper. Halo/Rocky hides from the thunder and lightning. Casper has to find Halo/Rocky – then the roles are switched.

Activity 2:

Draw the three kittens on a piece of scrap paper and then encourage your child to use drawing or painting to create the weather in the picture. They could draw big clouds and jaggy lightning for a thunderstorm, long rays of sunshine shining on the kittens, lots of snow falling and so on. You could do a new picture for each type of weather – or make lots of layers of weather one on top of the other in one picture. Have fun with the process rather than thinking too much about the end product! For example, if you are making rain you could give your child very watered down paint to splatter all over the kittens!

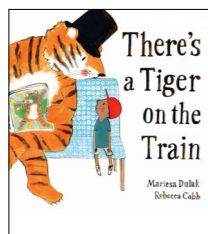

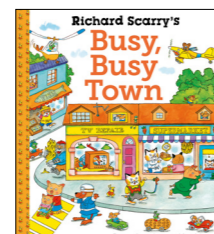

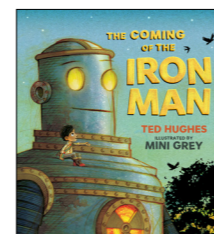

Book chat:

1. If you had your own unicorn, what would it look like and what magical powers would it have?
2. What kind of secrets do you think might be written in a unicorn diary?
3. I wonder where you could go on a unicorn adventure. Would you travel into a magical world?

A game you could play:

Set up a 'unicorn adventure trail.'

You could use cushions, chairs, or toys to make stepping stones or obstacles, and pretend you are riding unicorns through a magical land. Add sparkle by playing music, using a scarf as a unicorn's mane, or hiding a 'magical treasure' (like a toy or favourite snack) at the end of the trail for your unicorns to find. You could draw a map of your route!

Activity 2:

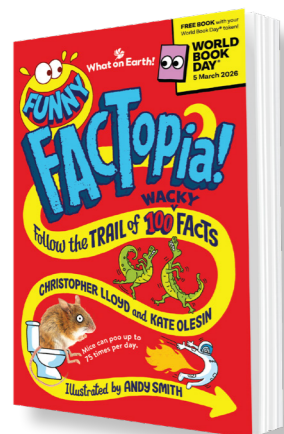

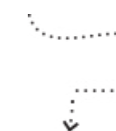
Activity 1:

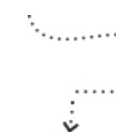

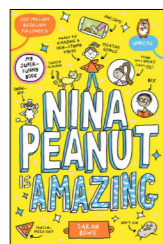
Activity 1:

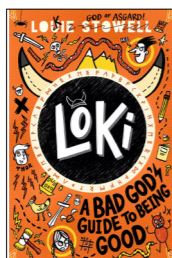

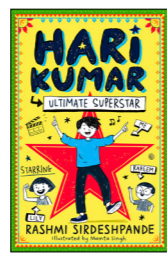

3. Have you ever set up your own club or gone to someone else's? What do you think is the best thing about being in a club?

A game you could play:

Join Pia's Pet Club!

Here's a game for 2 or more players.

Imagine you are a member of Pia's Pet Club.

One player chooses a pet to be – you could be a dog, a cat, a rabbit, a fish, a guinea pig or even an iguana! Can you bark like a dog? Swim like a fish? Or wiggle your nose like a rabbit? The other player's job is to train the pet. Give simple commands like 'Sit', 'Stay', 'Come here' or 'Do a trick!' and see if the pet can follow these instructions.

If you have more than one other player, then the trainer can choose which pet was the best at listening or had the best trick.

Activity 1:

Have fun role-playing your own version of the story with your child. Choose an animal toy to be in the starring role – or draw and cut out an animal shape. Taking turns, one of you hides the toy and the other person hunts for it. You could choose character roles from the book if you like.

Paint an iguana on a pebble/stone and then release it into the wild! Find a spot in your house where you think your iguana might like to live. They like warm wet places!

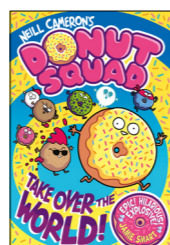

First think of situations they might face: for example “A wild unicorn suddenly charges at them out of the forest”, “Skandar falls from his mount”, “The wind changes direction suddenly and they are blown off course”. Think of six and write them on separate pieces of paper. Fold them and put them to one side.

THEN think of six magic spells: for example “Becomes invisible”, “Turns the opposition to stone”, “Creates a fire”, “Creates complete calm”. Fold them and put them in a separate pile. Make sure you have the same number of challenges as you have spells.

Take turns to take a challenge, unfold and read it, and then take a spell. How does your spell solve the situation? Was it the right spell? Would another spell have worked better; don't forget, Albert is still learning!

2. Keep it in your head.
3. Give your partner 3 clues to see if they can guess what you are eating

"I'm thinking of breakfast. My food is yellow and white. Sometimes it's boiled. Sometimes it's scrambled. What am I going to eat?"

Activity 1:

Make a pizza with your child – cut a circle out of paper or card and draw your favourite toppings. Cut the pizza into slices and pretend to share the pizza together. Share the slices between the two of you. Then invite a teddy or two and share them out again.

Activity 2:

Your child may enjoy it if you role-play some very bad sharing! Maybe choose one of your child's teddies to be bad at sharing. This teddy refuses to share his toys. He might, for example, grab all the Lego... Encourage your child to help the teddy share! If your child enjoys a physical element to their play you could play this with cushions. The teddy heaps up all the cushions for themselves... Your child tries to share them out fairly... .

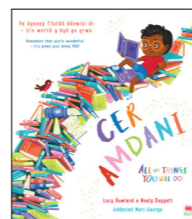
